


District Shines with 5-STAR STATE REPORT CARD Achievement

Each year, the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce releases State Report Cards. Districts are rated on a five-star scale with five being the highest. This is intended to show community members and business partners how well schools are doing at preparing students for their future.

For the 2023-2024 school year, Chippewa Local Schools went from 4.5 stars to 5, demonstrating that we are significantly exceeding state standards across all graded categories: Achievement (5 stars), Progress (4 stars), Gap Closing (5 stars), Graduation (4 stars) and Early Literacy (4 stars).

This is a testament to our staff and students' hard work, and our community's continued support!

District Refinances Bonds

I'm pleased to share some encouraging news about our district's ongoing commitment to being good stewards of taxpayer dollars. We are in the process

of refinancing a portion of the 2016 bonds that were originally issued to fund the construction of Chippewa Junior/Senior High School.

The county auditor is responsible for collecting the funds necessary to repay these bonds through property taxes. By refinancing at a lower interest rate, we can reduce the total amount owed on these bonds. In turn, this means the county auditor will collect less in property taxes to cover the payments, directly lowering the financial burden on our community.
