As we wrap up another successful school year, I am thrilled to share some wonderful achievements and updates from our district.

First, congratulations to our graduating class. Your hard work and dedication have led you to this incredible milestone, and we are proud of all you have accomplished.

We are also excited to announce that Chippewa Local Schools is the recipient of the \$30,000 Ohio Attorney General Safe Schools Grant. This funding will significantly enhance security measures at Serpentini Stadium at Memorial Park. Special thanks to Jodie Hughes, Chief Tester, Mayor Lindeman, and Village Leadership for their collaboration in securing this grant.

Our Hazel Harvey Elementary Preschool Program earned a prestigious 5-star rating from the state of Ohio for meeting quality standards in early education. This recognition highlights our commitment to excellence in providing high-quality early education.

We have several key leadership appointments effective August 1. Robert Marshall has been named the new Director of Operations, Timothy W. Adams will be the new Principal of Chippewa Jr./Sr. High School and Jud Hartman has been appointed as the new Assistant Principal. These experienced educators bring a wealth of knowledge and leadership to our district, and we're excited to have them on board.

The Chippewa Intermediate School expansion project is underway to accommodate all PreK-6 students on a single campus. You can read more on page 4. We also unveiled a new multipurpose room at Chippewa Intermediate School, thanks to generous community donations.

Our students have been actively engaged in various projects and activities. Fifth graders participated in a project-based learning assignment to create their own lemonade stands, integrating lessons from Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, and Math. We also had a successful STEAM Night and our Physics and AP Calculus students enjoyed their annual trip to Cedar Point.

In athletics, our girls' basketball team made it to the Elite 8 in the Division III OHSAA state girls basketball tournament. In wrestling, Kayla Moroschan won the state title, making history as the first female in Wayne County to do so. Our girls' wrestling team placed seventh in the state, and Coach Hanna Hall was named NE District Women's Coach of the Year.

Thank you for your support and dedication to Chippewa Local Schools. Your involvement plays a crucial role in our student's success and the overall growth of our district. Enjoy your summer!

# From the Treasurer's Chair

Good investments! That's what I'm talking about. Investments tend to be measured by the benefit received and usually measured in dollars returned to the investor. However, not all investments can be measured in dollars and cents. For example, we invest approximately \$11,000 per year, per student for the education of each child in our district to include not only academics but social and emotional development for a child beginning in kindergarten and graduating 13 years later. That represents a \$143,000 investment. What is the return? Difficult to measure in dollars and cents but here are some things to consider. 77% of our graduating class will enter college or a technical school this fall. Equally impressive, \$61,150 in scholarship money was awarded to individuals in the Class of 2024. Now consider the intangible benefits such as the positive impact on others, lives saved through scientific discovery or even personal sacrifice, to name a few. I would suggest that that \$143,000 investment has been a very good investment.

Another excellent investment was the \$140,000 committed to repurposing the multipurpose room at the Intermediate school. In a few short months, this room went from minimal usage to one of great demand for the benefit of our youth. The room is now a very functional area for basketball, volleyball, an indoor sports training area, pickleball and most importantly, an indoor playground during inclement weather. The return? Immeasurable as to the benefit this room will bring to our community.

The district recently invested \$10,000 in security cameras at the stadium. The total system cost \$40,000, with a state grant covering the \$30,000 difference. We invested \$10,000 and received \$40,000 in much-needed security equipment. This is a very healthy return that does not come close to measuring the safety and security benefits to the district and to those who attend functions at the stadium.

Last, my department works hard to ensure that the district is a good steward of the finances you provide for the education – academically, socially and emotionally – of the children of our district. To that end, I am pleased to report to you that I recently had a visit from the Ohio Auditor of State's department to present to the district the Ohio Auditor of State Award for excellence in financial reporting in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and compliance with applicable laws for the fiscal year ended 2023. I believe this is a first for the Chippewa Local School District!

# Message from the Board President

The 23-24 academic school year was marvelous! Our students received a multitude of awards from the Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA) to the Ohio All Student Choir to several athletic awards to Wayne County Career Center awards—some at the state level—and the list continues on and on. We are proud to have graduated 107 students in May, and the community support for our students was demonstrated at the Academic Awards in the amount of \$62,000—which included additional scholarships from previous years and larger scholarship award amounts. Thank you to our generous community.

This is the first time our district has been honored by the Ohio Auditor of State. Thank you, Mr. Hammon and staff.

The Chippewa Schools Board of Education nominated Mr. Todd Osborn for a Martha Holden Jennings Foundation award. In July, Mr. Osborn will receive a grant and a Superintendent Award of Excellence.

### Chippewa Awarded Ohio Attorney General Safe Schools Grant, Plans for Safety Improvements

We are excited to announce that, thanks to Jodie Hughes, Director of Literacy, Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment, Chippewa Local Schools is the recipient of the \$30,000 Ohio Attorney General Safe Schools Grant, the largest grant awarded this round. This funding will significantly enhance security measures at Serpentini Stadium at Memorial Park.

Jodie's commitment, in close collaboration with Chief Tester, Mayor Lindeman, and village leadership, has been instrumental in this achievement. Together with the Doylestown Police Department, we have designed a surveillance system that provides the Police Department 24-hour access to ensure continuous safety at the stadium.

In December, the Board supported this initiative with an initial approval of \$34,479.72 for surveillance cameras, contingent upon matching efforts from the Village Council. With the grant now secured, we are proceeding with our part of the project and introducing an additional camera that serves both the Village and the School District. This reduces our expenditure to \$9,772.07—\$24,707.65 less than planned.

The new camera will monitor the playground, fence line, and courts near the SUMMA Press Box from the picnic shelter. We thank the village for their vital support, from offering internet service to allowing us to use their power for the additional cameras, highlighting our strong and cooperative community relationship.

### HAZEL HARVEY ELEMENTARY PRESCHOOL PROGRAM EARNS 5-STAR RATING

The state of Ohio has awarded the Hazel Harvey Elementary Preschool Program a prestigious 5-star rating for meeting the quality standards established by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and the Ohio Department of Education.

Step Up To Quality is a 5-star Tier-Rated Quality Rating and Improvement System designed to recognize and promote early learning programs that exceed health and safety licensing requirements. We are proud of our preschool program's commitment to excellence and dedication to providing high-quality early education.



# Chippewa Intermediate School Expansion Project

Chippewa Intermediate School (CIS) is expanding to accommodate all PreK-6 students on a single campus. This decision follows a cost analysis, which determined that decommissioning the aging Hazel Harvey Elementary (built in 1956) is more economical than renovating it. The new construction at CIS avoids displacing students and brings several benefits, including reduced administrative and transportation costs, and a unified location for siblings.

#### What Will the Project Include?

The expansion will add approximately 15,000 square feet, including 10 new classrooms on the south side of the existing building. Renovations will modernize the current facilities and update mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems to support the expanded school.

#### **Next Steps**

The Board of Education is evaluating bids and subcontractor qualifications, with selections to be announced shortly. The project will be funded through the Expedited Local Partnership Program (ELPP) with the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) and Certificates of Participation (COPS), avoiding additional taxpayer burden.

### Estimated Cost and Timeline

The expansion is estimated to cost \$8.5 million, with no additional community funding required. Key dates include:

- April to May 2024: Schematic Design Phase
- May to June 2024: Design Development
- July to August 2024: Construction Documents Preparation
- October 2024: Start Construction

#### Plans for Hazel Harvey

Once the CIS expansion is complete, Hazel Harvey Elementary will be decommissioned. The district plans to sell the property, which will also alleviate traffic congestion in the area.

### New Multipurpose Room & Facility Upgrades

This year, Chippewa Intermediate School unveiled a new multipurpose room as part of an ongoing effort to upgrade school facilities. The multipurpose room was made possible through generous donations of time and money from the community.



To ensure long-term sustainability without burdening taxpayers, a maintenance replacement fund has been established, currently holding over \$50,000. This fund will help maintain the new facilities and support future upgrades.

Additional recent upgrades across the campus include:

Baseball Stadium: Upgrades to the stadium itself, including new turf, a sound system, improved seating, and better traffic flow to the press box.

Softball Field: The softball field has been relocated to the high school, creating an improved environment for games.

Tennis Courts: The tennis courts have been completely resurfaced in Chippewa blue.

Wrestling Room: The high school's wrestling room has been redone to accommodate both middle and high school teams.

Land Acquisition: The district purchased land next to the stadium, providing access to Gate Street and future expansion opportunities.

These upgrades reflect the district's commitment to providing topnotch facilities for students and the community, as well as fostering an environment that promotes physical activity, teamwork, and school spirit.



### Third Grade Entrepreneurs: Learning Business Through Project-Based Learning

Our third graders recently took part in a project-based learning (PBL) activity, creating their own bakery from the ground up. They began by collecting data on popular cupcake flavors and graphing the results. Using this information, they developed a business survey and started their business venture.

Students created a business name, designed a logo, and came up with a slogan. They then developed a menu and an advertising plan. The project culminated with students taking and fulfilling orders—their favorite part of the experience!

This PBL activity taught students valuable lessons about economics and business creation, giving them hands-on experience in entrepreneurship.

In Language Arts, students collaborated in small groups to develop a business name, motto, logo, and advertisements. In Science, they learned the engineering process by experimenting with lemonade recipes, perfecting the balance of lemon and sugar. Social Studies

lessons covered lemon-producing countries and budgeting for a shopping list. In Math, students conducted online surveys and displayed the data using bar and circle graphs.

This project integrated academic skills with teamwork, creativity, and problem-solving.



# **Students Excel at National Robotics Challenge**

Nineteen students from Chippewa Jr./Sr. High School showcased their engineering talent at the National Robotics Challenge (NRC) in Marion, Ohio, April 18-20. They won six awards across five of the 13 challenges, standing out among over 1,300 participants from 14 states.

The team, featuring 14 innovative robots, performed exceptionally, sweeping the Box Bot event. A highlight was Daniel Wilson's Micromouse robot, the only entry to autonomously navigate and solve a 100-square maze, surpassing both high school and college teams.

Chippewa's robotics program will be featured at the Wayne County Maker Extravaganza on July 27 at the Wayne County Fairgrounds. Students will showcase robots built from 1959 Erector sets, enhanced with modern robotics technology. The event will highlight local innovation and creativity.
